Motivation

Sustainability suffuses all we do and is, arguably, the globally talked about concept and, perhaps, least understood. This is partly due to the level of complexity associated with how the discourse around sustainability issues is framed, how the contexts associated with it are imagined; how the challenges associated with it are addressed and engaged, and how the resources and solutions offered are meaningfully operationalised. A host of stakeholders have a significant role to play in this regard, not the least of which are governments, practitioners, communities, academics, the third sectors, and users. The wider architecture, engineering and construction (AEC) sectors consume in excess of one-third of our energy use; over one quarter of all raw materials; and about half of our water use. In addition to this all other sectors are serviced or service the AEC sectors. The issue becomes one of interconnectedness and complexity, calling for interdisciplinary, joined-up, and holistic considerations. There is much to know and share.

Indeed, human habitat in the 21st century calls for more proactive efforts in its design construction, and delivery so as to ensure true sustainable developments.

In view of this, the conference seeks to explore key concepts, issues, and prospects of effective sustainable developments and delivery as it relates to the human habitat; with a view to joining forces in advancing our knowledge in this critical area of academic research and practice.

- **Keywords:** Provide up to five (5) keywords
